What is the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Funding?

- \$4.75 billion available over 5 years for all 50 states and territories
- Infrastructure installed every 50 miles along the Interstate Highway System (must be within 1 mile of the Interstate)
- At least four 150kW DC fast chargers with CCS ports capable of simultaneous charge
- Renewable energy generation (solar), storage (batteries), and upgrades of existing infrastructure qualify for funding
